Suspension of Play Policy

Approved OHSAA

A loud blast of an air horn will signal immediate suspension of play. ANY PLAYER WHO CONTINUES TO PLAY AFTER PLAY HAS BEEN SUSPENDED RUNS THE RISK OF BEING SUSPENDED. Seek shelter immediately.

All holes and shots that have been played will count. Play will resume from the point of interruption.

If lightening has been spotted/seen, seek shelter immediately. Coaches will be permitted to use golf carts to evacuate the golf course when it is safe to do so.

If possible, mark your ball when play has been suspended. Agree with your playing partners where all balls are in case it is not safe to mark them, or if markers have been removed or missing when play is resumed. For example, if tee shots have been hit and play is suspended, agree where all balls are to the best of everyone's ability.

Give the scorecard you are keeping to your coach for safekeeping in case play cannot be resumed on that day. Your coach can return it to you when play resumes. He will give scorecards to tournament personnel in the clubhouse if play cannot be resumed that day.

When play is resumed: DO NOT PRACTICE ON THE GOLF COURSE! The Rules Committee will make a decision on warming up prior to the resumption of play.

Play can be resumed when you hear two loud blasts of the air horn. Make certain you have been given the proper scorecards from your coach.
