Tournaments & Scheduling Conflicts

The NEDAB is tasked with coordination of all Sectional and District tournaments for Northeast District athletes. The OHSAA sets and posts a schedule of timeframes for each level of competition by event at the beginning of every school year. The NEDAB schedules tournament dates within those timeframes at the approved tournament sites based on the availability of the respective facility.

IT REMAINS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF INDIVIDUAL ATHLETE/PARENTS TO SCHEDULE TESTING AND OTHER NON-TOURNAMENT ACTIVITIES AROUND TOURNAMENT EVENTS. THE NEDAB WILL NOT RESCHEDULE EVENTS DUE TO ATHLETE/TEAM CONFLICTS.

What can the NEDAB do when a scheduled OHSAA tournament event conflicts with a holiday, national test, or school function?

- The NEDAB will try to adjust scheduling conflicts when they involve events like holidays, AP tests, commencements, or proms.
- The NEDAB will not be able to support scheduling conflicts that involve the frequently offered ACT or SAT exams, or when tournaments conflict with social events, such as after-prom or senior class trips.

The AP Tests will be given on the dates of the tournament. Please check with your players for AP Tests scheduled on any of the playing dates. **NOW** is the time to request with your guidance dept., an alternate time, date, and/or location for the players scheduled to take tests. Your other option is to place the player on the draw in a position so he might be able to make his match. You should have a substitute available if he does not get there on time. We **CANNOT** hold up the tournament for those taking the test. **NEW!! - The College Board has waived the fee for those taking the late-testing date.**
