Welcome to the 2026 District Wrestling Tournament at Perrysburg High School. It is the goal of the tournament staff to make the District Wrestling Tournament a smooth and successful experience for the wrestlers, coaches, and fans.

For teams arriving at Perrysburg High School, please take note that school will be in session. For this reason, teams will not be admitted into the school before 1:15 p.m. All **team** arrivals must enter the school from **Roachton Road** and will be directed to the designated south parking lot that has been reserved for team vehicles. Coaches and teams arriving on Friday shall enter the building through Door 44 (in the Northeast corner of the main gym adjacent to the designated parking lot). For fans and spectators, doors will open at 4:00 p.m. **NOTE- Spectators will not have access to the parking lot until 3:50pm after students are released from school and the parking lot is cleared.**

This Northwest District wrestling tournament is under the supervision and sponsorship of the Ohio High School Athletic Association, the Northwest District Athletic Board, and Perrysburg Exempted Village Schools.

Tournament Schedule

Friday, March 6

1:30 p.m. | Check-in

- *Enter at door 44 in Northeast corner of main gym
- *Please check in at the table upon arrival in door 44 hallway.
- *Review records listed and make corrections as needed.
- *Verify all names, spelling, and records listed on the sign-in sheet. Data will update automatically all the way through to the State Tournament for those wrestlers that qualify.

2:30 p.m. | Weigh-in & Skin Check in Auxiliary gym

- *Officials will check contestants for grooming and skin condition before weighing in for the tournament. Any physician's notes/releases must be available for officials at weigh-ins.
- *4 scales will be used for weighing in contestants. Scales will be open to check weights from 1:30 p.m. to 2:15 p.m.
- *All wrestlers shall be present and remain in the designated weigh-in area. Weigh-in by weight class. The weigh-in shall proceed through weight classes beginning at 106 lbs. and end immediately upon completion of the 285 lbs. class. A contestant may step on and off the first scale two times. If he fails to make weight on the first scale, he shall immediately step on each available scale one time in an attempt to make weight.

4:00 p.m. | School open to spectators

4:30 p.m. | Session 1 Start

Championship rounds 1 and 2

Weigh-outs

Will begin after the 144 lb matches of Championship round 2 and will end 30 minutes after the final match ends. Competitors cannot weigh in for Saturday until they have wrestled their final Friday match.

8:00 a.m. | Scales open for checking weight

8:30 a.m. | Weigh-in and skin check

9:15 a.m. | School open to spectators

10:00 a.m. | Session 2 Start

- *Consolation rounds 1 and 2
- *Championship semi-finals on mats 2 and 3 and Consolation round 3 on mats 1 and 4 will run together.
- *Consolation semi-finals.
- *Championship finals matches will run simultaneously on 3 mats after the conclusion of Consolation semi-finals.

Rules/Regulations

The National Federation Wrestling Rules, as may be modified by the OHSAA Board of Directors, shall be used in all wrestling tournaments sponsored by the OHSAA. All OHSAA bylaws and sports regulations apply to the conduct of the OHSAA wrestling tournament including the prohibition that, a student who uses anabolic steroids or other performance enhancing drugs is ineligible for interscholastic competition until such time as medical evidence can be presented that the student's system is free of anabolic steroids or other performance enhancing.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct Policy

During participation in OHSAA tournaments, any student or coach ejected for unsportsmanlike conduct or a personal foul, shall be ineligible for the remainder of that tournament as well as for all contests in wrestling until two regular season/ tournament contest (points) are competed at the same levels as the ejection. Individuals ejected for unsporting conduct shall be reported to the OHSAA commissioner's office by the tournament manager. The Commissioner's Office may impose additional penalties in accordance with Bylaw 11.

District Tournament Alternates

The use of an alternate from sectional to district or district to state is permissible when a qualifying wrestler cannot compete due to illness, injury, failure to make weight, flagrant misconduct or academic ineligibility. The alternate may be placed on the bracket up until the time that weigh-ins end. The alternate shall be the next highest finisher from the previous tournament. The alternate shall be placed on the vacated line of the bracket. No other wrestler will be moved on the bracket. **(No expenses will be paid nor free admission passes granted to alternates unless they actually participate.)**

Passes/Admission

Passes (to be used for coaches, school officials, mat maids) to be administered through HomeTown Tickets and based on the following:

1 – 2 competitors – five (5) passes (4 coach + 1)

3 – 5 competitors – six (6) passes (4 coach + 2)

6 or more competitors – eight (8) passes (4 coach + 4)

Competitors (participants) will be identified at the admissions table.

Cheerleaders / Mat Maids / Statisticians – included as above.

The person that uses a pass is up to the head coach of each school qualifying. Any additional personnel will need to purchase a ticket for admission.

Wristbands will be used for all non-wrestlers on the pass list. Wristbands must be issued at the pass gate entrance on the first day of competition.

Media and Photographers

All requests for media credentials at sectional/district tournaments shall be directed to the

tournament manager. Proper credentials must be presented for admission at the pass gate. Schools interested in **obtaining a media credential must notify the tournament director by March 4, 2026.**

Tournament Procedure

4 mats will be used Friday

Only wrestlers in uniform and coaches with participation passes will be allowed on the gym floor/mat side.

Only 2 coaches / team personnel will be permitted mat side – this will be strictly enforced. Violators may be removed from the gym for the remainder of the session. Wrestlers will be called on-deck to a specific mat and should be ready to wrestle (warm ups off and headgear on) as soon as the match before theirs on the assigned mat is completed.

Scoring/Awards

*Awards for each weight class will be presented in the auxiliary gym at the conclusion of each weight class.

*6 places will be scored – the top 4 place winners in each weight qualify for the OHSAA State Tournament

*Individual medals will be presented to the top 6 place winners in each weight

*Team awards will be presented to the District Champion team and Runner-Up

DRESS CODE FOR AWARDS:

All wrestlers receiving a sectional or district award will wear his/her team's wrestling warm-ups at the time of presentation.

Videotaping

All videotaping and photography must be done from the spectator area and shall not interfere with the view of other spectators!

Videotaping or filming by participating schools:

*Videotaping or filming of tournament contests by one or more schools participating in the contest is permitted provided prior arrangements are made with the tournament manager and it is done at the expense of the school involved. A maximum of one individual per school is permitted.

Videotaping or filming by spectators:

1. Videotaping will only be done from upstairs and shall be for personal use.
2. Shall not be used for the purpose of scouting or coaching.
3. Shall not interfere with the view of the athletic contest by other spectators.
4. The tournament site shall not permit the use of more than the seating space for which the spectator has paid when seating is needed for paid fans.
5. The tournament site accepts no liability for damage or theft of spectator equipment or injury as a result of privately owned equipment.
6. Equipment will not be permitted in any competition area – only in the spectator seating area.
7. The tournament site will not provide sources of power for video equipment.
8. Violation of this regulation may result in the removal of offender from the premises.

Inclement Weather

In the event that weather becomes an issue, Perrysburg Exempted Village Schools and the Northwest District Board will make the determination if the event will be delayed or canceled. Media will be contacted.

Professionalism of Coaches:

It is the moral obligation of all Ohio Wrestling Coaches to conduct themselves in a manner that reflects credit upon their high school, their profession and themselves. Personal grooming and appropriate dress is a standard of professionalism. **The wearing of jeans, t-shirts, sweat suits and warm-up suits (top or bottom), head wear and similar apparel are not considered suitable attire for coaches during the OHSAA Sectional, District or State Wrestling Tournaments and, therefore, are prohibited. Coaches who are inappropriately dressed will not be allowed on the competition floor.** Moral behavior and ethical conduct are part of winning and losing. Good sportsmanship, appearance, honor, and concern for the well-being of the competitors must be every coach's priority. The rules have been established in the spirit of this statement.
