Re: Division III Sectional Seed Meeting and Tournament

Your wrestling team has been assigned to participate in the Division III Sectional Wrestling Tournament at Lima Central Catholic on February 26, 2022. Most sectional tournaments will be one-day tournaments in 2022, as they the OHSAA has allowed a 6<sup>th</sup> match for a wrestler in the tournament run.

Please note Individual Tournament Regulations are posted on the OHSAA website. Rosters must be submitted online by **7:00pm on Thursday, February 24**; wrestlers are locked into their weights at that time. The **seeding meeting** is scheduled for Saturday morning, at 7:00am, ½ hour before weigh-ins. Brackets will be drawn, but will not be official until weigh-ins (at 4:00am) are confirmed.

Please make sure that the following actions are taken and that I receive the Alpha Master report and the wrestler weigh-in sheet prior to weigh-ins on Saturday:

**\*\*Alpha Master report and the wrestler weigh-in sheet**

Roster and seed information will be submitted online at [www.baumspage.com](http://www.baumspage.com) prior to Thursday, February 24 at 7:00 p.m. The entry window opened on Sun., Jan 23, 8:00am. An entry grid may be posted after 7:30pm on Thursday.

Seed criteria is uniform statewide and may be found in 11.6 and 11.7 of the 2022 OHSAA Individual Tournament Regulations. Criteria will include returning 2021 state placer (1-8) and 2021 district placer (1-6) and current record by percentage with a minimum of 12 matches. Freshmen with 25 or 20 wins who have defeated a criteriaed wrestler also may be considered for a seed, by criteria. \*A “quality” wrestler with fewer than 12 matches may be considered for seeding (\*see notes on following pages).

Individual tournament regulations were adopted on December 2. The NWDAB managers will receive further guidelines as the tournament approaches.

# 2022 Division III Sectional Wrestling

Use the Online Roster and Seed Form on [www.baumspage.com](http://www.baumspage.com) to submit entry data **before 7:00 PM, Thursday, Feb. 24, 2022!**

### Seeding Criteria:

- 1. State Place**
- 2. District Place**
- 3. Current Record: \*12-Match minimum - 50% or greater.**

Up to 8 wrestlers per weight class may be seeded. Wrestlers will be listed on the Seed Nomination Form based on the above criteria. Coaches may submit a request to add a wrestler to the seed nomination list with a winning record but fewer than 12 matches by e-mailing supporting documentation to the tournament manager at least 24 hours in advance of the seeding meeting. Final seeding will be done at the seed meeting. Challenges will be allowed for head-to-head and higher placement in the same weight class at a common tournament. Disposition of challenges will be coach's vote or concession by the coach of the nominated seed under challenge.

### **To enter roster and seeds online:**

1. If you are not a "computer user" find an assistant, parent, friend or athlete to help you out.
2. Go to [www.baumspage.com](http://www.baumspage.com) and click on **Online Entry** or **Login**. Please note the following:  
All accounts from last year were retained, but the associations with schools and teams were cleared. If you have an account, use that e-mail address and password to login.  
If you do not have an account, click on **Apply** and create one.
3. Please set up your account **NOW**. You may finalize your roster later, but setting up and testing your account **NOW** will eliminate potential problems later.  
If you forgot your password use the **Forget your Password** link to request a new one.  
If you have problems click the **Help** link on the **Login Page** or use the **Contact Us** link.

4. **Submit an "intended" roster early! Return anytime before deadline to make changes!**
  - a. After login, use **Coaches | Select Teams** to claim your **School** and **Sport**.
  - b. Use **Coaches | Wrestling | Modify Athletes** to enter your **athlete's names and grades**.
  - c. Use **Coaches | Wrestling | Submit Rosters** to enter wrestlers into their weight classes.
    - i. Click on the weight and **Select a wrestler**.
    - ii. Enter the appropriate tournament seeding information where applicable
    - iii. Records are required for every wrestler entered in the sectional tournament!
    - iv. Submit a Current Won/Lost record.

Click **Submit Rosters** to submit your tournament entry form.

The form will not be accepted until you enter a record for every wrestler!

Use **Get Printable Roster** to print a copy for your records.

**The entry window will close precisely at 7:00 PM on Thursday, February 24<sup>th</sup>!**

1. You may login and make changes anytime prior to the entry deadline!
2. Always click **Submit Rosters** to submit the changes!

**All entries and seeding criteria must be submitted via baumspage.com before 7:00 PM on Thursday, February 24. Schools will be subject to a \$150 fine for wrestlers entered after the deadline!**

Please submit a tentative roster early! Then login again and finalize it before the deadline.

**After 7:00 PM Thursday, all wrestlers are locked into the weight class as submitted!**

The only exceptions will be for those scenarios outlined in **Section 10.3 of the OHSAA Individual Tournament Regulations.**

Re: Coaches Information

Please refer to Official Tournament Regulations issued by OHSAA as well as the Northwest District Board's website ([www.nwdab.org/wrestling/wrestling.htm](http://www.nwdab.org/wrestling/wrestling.htm)) for site and school assignment information.

Coaches are responsible for the conduct and behavior of all their teams members, both competing and noncompeting. Any acts of unsporting behavior, vandalism, misuse of the facility, etc. will cause immediate removal and/or legal action. Athletes will be deemed to have caused a flagrant act and ejected from the tournament.

## Rules/Regulations

4.1 The National Federation Wrestling Rules, and the regulations set forth by the OHSAA Board of Directors, shall be used in all wrestling tournaments sponsored by the OHSAA.

### Rule 28 Professionalism of Coaches:

It is the moral obligation of all Ohio Wrestling Coaches to conduct themselves in a manner that reflects credit upon their high school, their profession and themselves. Personal grooming and appropriate dress is a standard of professionalism. The wearing of jeans, t-shirts, sweat suits and warm-up suits (top or bottom), head wear and similar apparel are not considered suitable attire for coaches during the OHSAA Sectional, District or State Wrestling Tournaments and, therefore, are prohibited. Coaches who are inappropriately dressed will not be allowed on the competition floor. Moral behavior and ethical conduct are part of winning and losing. Good sportsmanship, appearance, honor, and concern for the well-being of the competitors must be every coach's priority. The Rules have been established in the spirit of this statement.

### Rule 29 Unsporting Conduct Policy:

During participation in OHSAA tournaments, any student or coach ejected for unsportsmanlike conduct or a flagrant foul shall be ineligible for the remainder of that tournament as well as for all contests in wrestling until two regular season/tournament contests (points) are competed at the same levels as the ejection. Individuals ejected for unsporting conduct shall be reported to the OHSAA Commissioner's Office by the tournament manager. The Commissioner's Office may impose additional penalties in accordance with Bylaw 11.

### Rule 30 Property:

There is no insurance covering property damage. If property is damaged at a tournament site by competing school teams, student body or spectators, the school from which the students and/or spectators come shall be liable and pay the cost of repair or replacement. The tournament manager is authorized to deduct from the school's share the cost of any damages caused by the competitors, coaches or followers. Other damages to the facilities not attributed to a competing school could be a legitimate tournament expense and may be deducted from tournament receipts. If damage is extensive, the NWDAB or OHSAA Commissioner's Office will become involved.

### Alpha Master:

The minimum weight as listed on the Alpha Master Report and the alpha master weigh-in sheet must be provided to the tournament manager prior to the start of the sectional tournament. Wrestle only at the allowable weight or any weight class above as specified by the rules.

### **Videotaping:**

Videotaping or filming by participating schools is permitted provided prior arrangements are made with the tournament manager and it is done at the expense of the school involved. \*See Tournament Regulations.

Videotaping or filming by spectators shall be for personal use. \*See Tournament Regulations.

### **2022 ADMISSION PRICES:**

**Single Session: \$8.00 Pre-Sale. \$10.00 at the door. Tickets must be purchased in advance online thru HomeTown Ticketing.**

### **PASS LIST:**

**A pass list will be used at LCC.** All lines **can** be filled. Only one wrestler per weight class will be admitted.

**Sectional Pass List:** wrestlers do not count in pass totals

The sectional pass list used will be determined by the number of wrestlers from each school.

A school with **eight (8) or more** wrestlers will be issued **11 passes**.

A school with **seven (7) or fewer** wrestlers will be issued **8 passes**.

**Please complete the attached fillable pass list. You may return it in advance as indicated on the form.**

### **CONTESTANT WEIGH-INS**

Weigh-ins and skin checks will be conducted at the tournament site in accordance with NF Rule 4-5 and OHSAA procedures. Weigh-in for the sectional and district tournaments will be conducted by weight class at **7:30am**.

# SECTIONAL/DISTRICT WRESTLING TOURNAMENTS

## Northwest District Seeding 2022

### SEEDING/DRAWING: Sectional Coaches Meeting - 7:15 am on **Saturday, February 26, 2022.**

A meeting of coaches or faculty representatives from the competing schools is to be held for the drawing and to discuss in detail the operation of the Sectional meet. A letter detailing the time, place and any special instructions shall be sent to each coach at least two weeks before the Sectional meet.

All wrestlers with a .500 record or better from the current season (minimum of 12 matches) will be seeded with a maximum of 8 seeds per weight class. Any wrestler that fails to reach the 12 match minimum, regardless of the situation, may not be seeded. **(See below if a wrestler has quality wins but not 12 matches)**

A wrestler meeting the seeding criteria will be seeded.

The seeds will be placed on the preliminary bracket in accordance with the NFHS Rule 10. Byes and non-seeded wrestlers will be placed on the bracket by the computer.

A wrestler may only be seeded in one weight class.

If a seeded wrestler drops out or fails to make weight:

Seeded wrestlers will be rotated accordingly to the appropriate line

Non-Seeded wrestlers lines on the bracket will become byes if a bye is legal.

If a bye is not permitted, a coin flip (or series of flips) will determine which line will become a bye and which wrestler must be moved to make the bracket legal.

In accordance with NFHS Rule 10-3-1, there shall be no byes after the first round of competition in both the championship and consolation brackets. The first round of the tournament in the particular weight class could be the quarterfinal or semifinal round depending on the number of entries.

The **Seed Nomination List** will only include wrestlers that meet the OHSAA Seeding Criteria.

Coaches will have an opportunity to review the information submitted and report any errors to the tournament manager.

A wrestler may only be added to, or deleted from, the list if there was an error in reporting his credentials.

Coaches may submit a request to add a wrestler with a winning record but fewer than 12 matches to the seed nomination list by e-mailing supporting documentation to the tournament manager at least 24 hours in advance of the seeding meeting.

### **Seeding Criteria:**

Must have a .500 record or better with a minimum of 12 matches.

Returning state placer (1-3) at any weight class.

Returning state placer (4-8) at any weight class. A “new” (freshman or upper classman that was not a contender last year) wrestler that has more than 25 wins, has defeated a wrestler listed above him/her on the list, and has a higher winning percentage will be seeded above the returning state place winner at any weight class (4-8). \*The coach must e-mail the credentials to the tournament manager at least 24 hours in advance of the seeding meeting.

Returning district placer (1-6) at any weight class. A “New” (freshmen or upper classman that was not a contender last year) wrestler that has more than 20 wins, has defeated a wrestler listed above him/her on the list, and has a higher winning percentage than the returning district place winner will be seeded above the returning district place winner at any weight class. \*The coach must e-mail the credentials to the tournament manager at least 24 hours in advance of the seeding meeting.

For a “quality” wrestler that does not meet the 12 match threshold, coaches may submit a request to add a wrestler with a winning record but fewer than 12 matches to the seed nomination list by emailing supporting documentation to the tournament manager at least 24 hours in advance of the seeding.

### Tiebreakers:

The higher placer at each level earns the higher seed

If two or more wrestlers have identical place finishes, the wrestler returning at the same weight class earns the higher seed

Previous year’s tournament place finish MUST have been at an OHSAA tournament

A return placer can be from Division I, II, or III.

In cases where there is a tie on seed and the coaches vote, a coin will be used to break the tie for the seed.

Won/Loss Record (by percentage) from the current season (minimum of 12 matches).

In the event of a tie in percentage, the wrestler with the most wins will receive the higher seed.

If this does not break the tie, a coin-flip will determine the seed.

### Seed Meeting:

A seed meeting will be held after the wrestlers have been seeded by criteria. It will be held on Saturday, February 26, 2022 @ 7:00am.

A coach may challenge a pre-seed. When challenging a pre-seed, please make sure you have statistics to support your claim. Challenges will be permitted for head-to-head competition and higher placement in a same weight class at common tournaments. The coach's vote or concession will be final.

Seed Meeting Procedures:

We will seed up to eight wrestlers each class based on the following criteria (the criteria is a starting point):

1. State Place from 2021.
1. District Place from 2021.
2. Head to head competition against other seed nominees.
3. Record against common opponents.
4. Current overall record (top winning percentage.)

B. A coach may challenge a pre-seed:

- When challenging a pre-seed, please make sure you have statistics to support your claim.
- Consider Head-to-Head Match-up, Common Opponent (from NWDAB Addendum)

C. Brackets will be drawn during the meeting, but will not be official until after weigh-ins are completed!

7:30 AM **Weigh-in and Skin Check:** All wrestlers shall be present and remain in the designated weigh-in area.

9:30 AM First Round (2,3,3.5,4)

Quarterfinals (5,6,6.5,7)

First Consolation (1,2,2.5,3) \*Actually Second Consolations on the 16-man bracket!

Semifinals (11,12,12.5,13) & Third Consolation (4,5,5.5,6)

\*Semifinals and Third Consolation wrestled simultaneously.

Consolation Semifinals (5,6,6.5,7)

Short break following the consolation semi-finals

**We will use a match board to help athletes, coaches and fans track progress of the tournament. Please have wrestlers in the warm-up area as their match approaches; wrestlers will be called from the warm-up area much like the state tournament. Please do not crowd the staging area in anticipation of a match. Only two coaches or a coach and wrestler are permitted in the 2 chairs at the edge of the mat.**

Please check with your district qualifiers to confirm that the data listed on the qualifier form is correct. Sectionals at Lima Central Catholic (NW), Covington (SW), Lehman Catholic (SW) and Reading (SW) each will qualify four (4) per weight class to the district tournament at Troy Hobart Arena March 4-5. The fifth place finisher will be an alternate. Please notify the District Manager ASAP if you know your qualifier will not be able to compete at the Troy district. Four (4) wrestlers from Troy will qualify for the OHSAA State Tournament March 11-13.

## Message to Sectional Wrestling Coaches

An OHSAA goal is to have common policies and procedures at all sectional tournaments that will be consistent across the state.

Click the [OHSAA Seed Meeting Guidelines](#) link to view the process used for challenges at the Seed Meeting. Challenges will be permitted for head-to-head competition and higher placement in a common weight class at the same tournament. Before seeding the weight class, all requests for nominations of wrestlers with less than 12 matches will be evaluated and approved or rejected by a vote of the coaches.

## **The Weigh-In Team & Procedure**

**The Tournament Manager (TM)** is ultimately in charge of the smooth operations of the entire wrestling event. The (TM) then coordinates all aspects of the event. The weigh-in of contestants begins the official action of setting the bracket for each weight class. The procedure listed below will assist making the weigh-ins as efficient as possible without interruption.

The (TM) shall verify all scales are recently certified by the county weights and measures department, be placed in the weigh-in room, balanced to zero with ample time allotted for wrestlers to check their weight prior to the start of actual weigh-ins. Same gender weigh-ins and special accommodations shall be made for all female contestants based upon NFHS rules.

The (TM) should coordinate with the assigned Head Official (HO). There should be a team of three in place for each scale to the complete field of wrestlers. Each scale should have an official, a recorder and an assistant recorder. At the start of weigh-ins all wrestlers should be in the weigh-in room, if space allows and no one is allowed to either dehydrate or rehydrate. All exercise must stop when the weigh-in process begins for everyone. Wrestlers may wear low-ankle socks during weigh-in. Any wrestler over-weight shall immediately re-weigh on the same scale once, if he/she is still over-weight the participant gets one try on every other scale in his/her assigned weigh-in room. During any re-weigh in the athletes must step on the scales exactly as he/she did the first time. Duties are listed below.

**Official** - to inspect each male wrestler and compliance with the NFHS health and safety check. This includes; length of hair (H), fingernails (N), shave (S), mustache (M), skin inspection and physician's note and the legality of any special equipment. If any adjustments need to be made, the official shall instruct the recorder to mark the necessary correction on the weigh-in form. The on-site physician has the final decision on skin issues.

**Recorder** – to record all information necessary as it pertains to each individual athlete on the (TM) weigh-in form. Example: if the fingernails need trimmed he should record (N), etc. Next, **the exact weight needs to be read aloud and recorded for each participant during every weigh-in session.** The recorder needs to be informed of a few changes in weight classes. First, the minimum weight for the heavy weight wrestler based on the time of season and growth allowance. Note: 215 lb. at the start of the season, then 217 lb. after December 25th. Second, the extra pound(s) necessary for the second day of a two-day event, weather related increase and the increase if a school had an event the day before shall be added. **The recorder shall also be informed if an athlete is to make his/her scratch alpha weight.** This should first be **the responsibility of the coach to notify the (TM)** who in turn will notify the weigh-in staff. **The athlete shall also declare to the weigh-in team his/her intention to make his/her scratch alpha weight.**

**Assistant Recorder** - It is recommended the third adult observer be a coach, randomly selected to assist with the reading of the scale, recording of the data and to generally confirm all is being done so the checking process moves along properly. These three men are to work as a team and communicate as is necessary to ensure a smooth weigh-in.

At the conclusion of weigh-ins the official shall sign the weigh-in sheets from his respective scale. The prompt return of the weigh-in forms to the (TM) allows any re-draws efficiently completed and the tournament to start on time. The (TM) shall designate with the (HO) the team(s) of weigh-in personnel for the following morning second weigh-in. The weigh-in forms should be so created to allow for the recording of multiple day events.

**Weigh-out** - If a first day weigh-out is utilized, this will begin after the **144** weight-class and end 30 minutes after the last heavyweight match. Wrestlers who have completed their competition for the first day may report to the scale room to weigh-out when it is announced. During the weigh-out process, participants may have multiple attempts on the scale(s), they may exercise, and they may use the restroom.

**Skin Checks** – Skin checks must be conducted in a private room each day before the start of competition. For instance, if you have a 2-day Sectional, skin checks must be conducted on Saturday morning in addition to Friday afternoon.
